RNI Safety TOPIC of the Month: Distracted Driving

Distracted driving has become a deadly epidemic on our roads. While drivers texting behind the wheel tops what seems like an endless list of distractions, other risky actions include talking — whether it be on the phone or to others in the car, setting your navigation, adjusting what you're listening to, drinking coffee, applying makeup, and more. By driving distracted, you're robbing yourself of seconds that you may need to avoid a close call or deadly crash.

In 2020, <u>distracted driving</u> killed 3,142 people. Young drivers seem more prone to using their phones while driving. According to NHTSA research from 2017, drivers 16 to 24 years old have been observed using handheld electronic devices while driving at higher rates than older drivers have since 2007. But make no mistake: It isn't just young people who are driving distracted, since drivers in other age groups don't lag far behind.

Drive Responsibly

April, which is national Distracted Driving Awareness Month, is a good time to regroup and take responsibility for the choices we make when we're on the road. Follow these safety tips for a safe ride every time:

- Need to send a text? Pull over and park your car in a safe location. Only then is it safe to send or read a text.
- Designate your passenger as your "designated texter." Allow them access to your phone to respond to calls or messages.

Do not scroll through apps, including social media, while driving. Cell phone use can be habit-forming. Struggling to not text and drive? Put the cell phone in the trunk, glove box, or back seat of the vehicle until you arrive at your destination.

The Consequences

During a portion of Distracted Driving Awareness Month, from April 4 through 11, you may see increased law enforcement on the roadways as part of the national paid media campaign <u>U Drive. U</u> <u>Text. U Pay</u>. This campaign reminds drivers of the deadly dangers and the legal consequences – including fines – of texting behind the wheel. Also, on April 7 state highway safety offices and law enforcement agencies across the country will take part in Connect to Disconnect, a 4-hour national distracted driving enforcement and awareness initiative. The goals: to demonstrate a nationwide commitment to enforcing texting laws in a fair and equitable way, and to reduce traffic crashes caused by distracted drivers, ultimately preventing injuries and deaths associated with cell phone use and texting while driving.

April Board Member Spotlight: Merris Welge

The April Board Member Spotlight is Merris Welge. After graduating from Bucyrus High School without any career path in mind, Merris attended Tiffin University and received a 2-year education in Accounting & Business Administration. A local Bucyrus bank just happened to be looking for an employee, and as they say - the rest is history!

Joining the Second National Bank (SNB) in the bookkeeping department, advancing to teller, assistant cashier and then to cashier & Vice President. During his employment at SNB, he attended various banking schools, including the National Association of Bank Auditors & Controllers and the Central States School of Banking, both held at the University of Wisconsin at Madison. Each school was 2 weeks a year, lasting for 3 years each. Also, during his employment at SNB he was a loan officer, oversaw personnel, worked with various advertising media, and worked in the transition from mechanical to electronic banking. He was a



member of the Bucyrus Jaycees, and a founding member & President of the Young Y's Men Club, said to be the first integrated Y's Men Club in the state. Merris was also president of the local Chapter of N.A.B.A.C. Merris left banking for short time, joining with 3 friends to start & manage a plastic injection molding & extrusion business. An unsuccessful short time venture, so back to banking.

Merris joined the First National Bank (FNB) of Mansfield, managing numerous branches as Assistant Vice President and managing the Installment Loan Department. As Vice President, plus working as a business lender and a real estate loan lender, he was also in charge of Compliance, i.e. complying with Federal Regulations. During his employment Merris attended various banking schools, including the National Commercial Lending School and the National Compliance School, both at the Oklahoma University. During his employment at FNB, he volunteered with Habitat for Humanity, serving on the Board of Directors. He joined the Sertoma Club & continued that membership for 35 years and was a member & served as president of the local chapter of National Association of Credit Managers.

After several mergers & name changes, Merris retired from Society Bank, just at it was merging into KeyBank. Since retiring, Merris has volunteered with SCORE, serving as Chapter Chair 3 times & is currently Office Manager. Merris serves on several Chamber of Commerce committees, was a long-time member of Sertoma, served on the Board of Directors at Third Street Clinic, and is honored to be on the Board, and serve RNI as Treasurer. He and his wife Jean reside in Ontario & recently celebrated their 50th wedding anniversary. They have 4 adult children, all living in Ohio. They enjoy traveling, having traveled in all 50 states, and most of the Canadian Provinces. Merris enjoys his bartending at Chamber of Commerce events, and occasionally serves Jack (RNI, Inc. Board President).
