OOD honors Shannon Skidmore in their Monthly Newsletter

You can do it. You can get a job. You can do what you want to do, and you should always believe in yourself.

Shannon Skidmore has always been passionate about helping other people. Prior to graduating from Mohawk High School in 2020, Shannon could often be found helping other students in her resource classes. She was first referred to OOD by her teacher, Mr. Eric Daniel, due to communication challenges from an Intellectual Disability. Shannon started working with Kate Jones, OOD Senior Vocational Rehabilitation Counselor, to plan for her future career in December 2019. Shortly after graduation, Shannon received job readiness training services from Richland Newhope Industries (RNI) and participated in Summer Youth Foundations. Even during the COVID-19 pandemic, which forced Shannon to virtually participate in these services, she has remained upbeat. Her Job Coach, Darlene Loughery, expressed great appreciation for how helpful and motivational Shannon was to other students participating in Summer Youth Foundations. "She was our personal cheerleader," Darlene stated. Shannon progressed to Job Development services with Danielle Adkins from RNI. Danielle started working with Shannon to practice interview questions, learn to write resumes, and discuss job applications. Using these new skills, Shannon independently obtained employment with an OOD Employer Partner, Liquibox, and began working on September 1, 2020. As a laborer at Liquibox, Shannon is responsible for small assembly and quality checks. She operates various machines throughout the facility, which helps produce parts for fast food restaurants and equipment for hospitals. During the COVID-19 pandemic, assisting others in this way is one of her favorite aspects of the job. Shannon also values her coworkers, explaining, "We all work together as a family; we help each other, we're there for each other. I just really enjoy being there. "Shannon is a joy for others to be around, too. "Shannon has such a caring and giving personality. She will gladly do anything she can to help someone, and her kindness is contagious. The future will be very bright for Shannon. I am honored to have worked with—and learned from her during her transition to adulthood," said Kate. In addition to her coworkers, Shannon credits her mom, stepdad, Mr. Daniel, Mr. Hawkins, and Kate with helping her attain this benchmark. "OOD helped me learn more things about work areas, how to work, how to be safe at work, and what kind of job I wanted. "Her advice to others with disabilities is simple: "You can do it. You can get a job. You can do what you want to do, and you should always believe in yourself."
