RNI, Inc. Watering Crew is keeping Downtown Mansfield looking good

The RNI, Inc. watering crew is back and caring for the baskets and planters in downtown Mansfield. RNI partners with Downtown Mansfield Inc. (DMI) on the planters and Richland Community Development Group (RCDG) on the baskets in the downtown area. They contacted service clubs, merchants, garden clubs and other civic organizations for help. Many responded with donations and most importantly, volunteer their time. The designs for the floral planting were provided by Justin Marotta. The 72 baskets are made up of Dragon wing Begonia Pink, Lantana yellow, Petunia, Coleus and Thunbergia yellow. The round planters have been planted with Kong Coleus Salmon, Dragon Wing Begonia Pink, Sunpatiens White, Lantana Yellow and Weeping Lavender and some with Dichondra. The rectangular planters are made of the following plants, Cyperus Baby Tut, Kong Coleus Salmon, Dragon Wing Begonia Pink, Sunpatiens White, Lantana Yellow and Weeping Lavender. There are a total of 101 planters in and around Downtown. The city was supportive of preparing planters and handling watering and some of the maintenance of the planters. Mansfield in Bloom now plays a significant role in ensuring that Central Park and much of the balance of the downtown is coated with floral colors during the warm weather months. The watering, which includes the addition of some fertilizer for the downtown flowers, is being handled on alternating weeks by the city and Newhope Industries. Pictured here is waterer Sarah and she is being supported by her Job Coach, JoAnn Winters. Take a look up and around the next time you are in Downtown Mansfield and see all of the flowers that are kept looking beautiful by RNI, Inc.
