The advisors for the Richland County Chapter are Sean Laird, RNI, Troy Smith, Sherry Minnig, and Anna Salas from the Richland County Board of DD. People First began in Ohio in 1998 by a group of self-advocates who wanted to improve their abilities to represent themselves and to train others to be self-advocates. People First of Ohio has members from teens through adults and helps to set up local chapters of people with disabilities who are self-advocates. The local chapters focus on helping others with disabilities become self-advocates and work mostly on local issues and report to the state what they would like to see happen on a state/and federal level. We believe that all people with disabilities should be treated as equal and be able to speak up for what they want by serving as leaders and working together as a team with all members of the community. People First of Ohio assists people with disabilities who are self-advocates to talk about their needs and rights

with people in their communities. Selfadvocates make sure people with disabilities have the right to do what they want in their lives, are responsible for their own choices, and have the right to live and do things in the community like other citizens.

Admission was free, but donations for the CCBDD food pantry were accepted: canned goods, boxed food and drinks, paper products, laundry detergent, cereal, toiletries, according to a news release. The donations help local families served by CCBDD. Monetary donations will benefit local Special Olympics. The turnout for the game was great and they were able to collect a lot of non-perishable items to be donated in the area.

RNI Safety TOPIC for May: Lockout/Tagout

An enormous 10% of industry safety incidents could be prevented by effective lockout/ tagout (LOTO) procedures, so ensuring your staff are up-to-date with their requirements is key. <u>According to OSHA</u>, good LOTO programs prevent "unexpected energization or startup of machinery and equipment or the release of hazardous energy during service or maintenance activities".

Often, the most serious workplace injuries involve heavy machinery. And, all machinery has a risk of injury. So, your LOTO program is critical to staff safety. Some questions to ask your coworkers include:

- What are the LOTO procedures for this piece of machinery?
- What are the common mistakes that we make?
- What are the consequences of not following LOTO procedures?
- Is there anything we can do to improve?
